2025 Provisional overview [Draft as of 25.11.24] Term 1 (8 week programme)

Please note that though I am planning to offer similar topic outlines in both Margaret River (Tuesdays at the Community Centre, Main Room) and through <u>Village Learning</u> in Vasse (Wednesdays, 363 Rendezvous Rd, Vasse) for the AFTERNOON sessions, the practical reality is that some content will inevitably vary as a reflection of the students who participate. Please note that I will be away the 1st and 2nd weeks of February, and begin on the 18th/19th February in 2025

TUESDAY MORNINGS IN MARGARET RIVER

9:30 - 11:30 am (approx)

Focus: reading and discussing Huxley's Brave New World - copy of book is required please!

WEDNESDAY MORNINGS IN VASSE (WITH VILLAGE LEARNING)

9:30 - 11:30 am (approx)

Focus: investigative development through history, religion and geography and science (similar in Term 2, with biographical references to specified artists; and to specified locations).

TWO researches and presentations, each over approx. four weeks. Choosing TWO people and one chemical element/compound listed below.

For religious leaders, some historical (and 'legendary' - ie, hagiographical) biography (including drawing or painting representation of person), geographical location (included on a world map of where they lived), extent of religious spread over time (including time periods), main tenets or teachings (including any guides, rules or laws for living).

One of: Lao Tsu; Mahavira; Gautama; Jesus; Mani AND one of: Mary Magdalene; Hildegard of Bingen; Teresa of Ávila

For the chemical substance, investigate how it naturally occurs compared to how it is commercially produced (or a derivative is produced), how it has historically been used (for what purposes, eg, in art, health or engineering), where it is mined (including maps or important regions); its impact on the body if consumed; and how it is currently used.

Sulphur; Fluorite; Salt; Calcium; Zinc; Cinnabar

TUESDAY AFTERNOONS IN MARGARET RIVER OR WEDNESDAY AFTERNOONS IN VASSE

12:30 - 2:30 pm (approx)

Focus on history and philosophy through the art of tarot - expected to be continued in Term 2

Each of the 'major arcana' (as they are commonly referred to) exhibits historical and philosophical content. We will be *tracing* some of the cards of the major arcana and colouring them, as we simultaneously explore some aspects of their symbolic representations.

I would encourage each person to have their own paints and paint brushes (acrylic, gouache, water or encaustic are all ok - but oil paint can have too many fumes for sensitive people). Colour needs to include at least black, white, red, yellow, green, and blue. A mixing plate is also recommended.
